## **Light Plan Comments:**

- Please show photometrics around all proposed lights on the lighting plan.
- The pedestrian path lights are shown as 6.2 feet tall and only produce 150 lumens. This is not enough light for the pedestrian pathway and a taller light would get tampered with less requiring much less maintenance throughout the lifetime of the luminaire.
- Add lights to the pedestrian pathways in the following locations:
  - o trail intersections

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- trail heads
- Why are lights shown around some trail intersections but not others? Please explain.
- Please call out the model of luminaire and heights on the lighting plan.
  - Are the specifications for the luminaires for the individual lots shown on page LO3? It is unclear to me which will be used.
- Additional lights should be added along the sidewalk along Creighton Road.
- Consider adding a light at the entrance to the driveway leading to the cell tower.
- All lights shall be switched on/off with photovoltaic cells. Please include a note indicating this.

# Landscape Plan Comments:

 Where are the white vinyl and black aluminum fence being proposed? Please show them on the landscape plan

### Site Plan Comments:

• Consider chaining off the driveway leading to the cell tower. Vehicular access should only be provided to the operator of the cell tower. If this area is not secured, it could become very challenging for the HOA to manage.
