#### **Crime Prevention**

- 1. All parking structures must be provided with security cameras and call boxes to provide for the security of patrons.
- 2. Per <u>§24-5508</u> CPTED Plans shall be provided for any business open to the public between 12 (midnight) and 6am.
  - a. A CPTED Plan must be submitted with an application for any plan of development or site plan where one of the uses listed in subsection B above is proposed. The CPTED Plan must include all information necessary to demonstrate that the proposed development complies with the CPTED principles listed in subsection A above. The CPTED Plan will be reviewed by the Chief of Police, who will make a recommendation to the Planning Director whether the CPTED Plan meets the requirements of this section. The Planning Director will review the CPTED Plan and recommendation and approve the Plan if it meets the requirements of this section.
